



Dear Parents,

Your student took the PSAT/NMSQT® or PSAT 8/9 test on October 12, 2022, and now we encourage you to review the results with your student. Your student's PSAT/NMSQT® or PSAT 8/9 results will become available on the College Board website starting December 5, 2022. At that time, you can go to the College Board website to access the score virtually.

Additionally, our student services team will be sending printed test results and test booklets to your home address in the next few weeks. We use these results to provide ongoing evaluations of our programs and curriculum. The results are also designed to help you understand your student's academic growth and compare it to other students nationally. Your family's monitoring of these scores will ensure your student is prepared for the next steps in the educational journey and will help your student find a college that is a good fit.

How to review your student's score report:

To access your student's score report online, please head to <https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt/scores>. Your student will need to make a College Board account. Please have them use their full legal name when creating the account and use an email address and password that they will remember. Keep record of that information somewhere safe for your student so they can access their scores in the future.

When you receive the printed test scores in the mail, we will include your student's test booklet so that you can review any questions you wish. We will also enclose the helpful document, *A Parent Tutorial for Understanding PSAT Results*. How to talk with your student about next steps:

College Board has leveled the playing field, giving all students access to tutoring in their weakest areas at no cost. It is up to the student to go online and practice for the spring SAT. **Your student can strengthen essential skills for the PSAT/SAT with free personalized practice on Khan Academy®.**

As a parent, you might consider asking your student to add you to their College Board account so you can monitor their practice. You may want to set a goal for your student to log a certain amount of practice time between semesters and over the summer. Some parents may consider rewarding this time since higher test scores translate to increased college financial aid.
